

Recommendations to the Global 'Key Demands' from the group of gender experts and CSO representatives from the region of Eastern Europe and Central Asia (Kyrgyzstan, Ukraine),

October 2011

Include the recommended amendments into the following parts of the Global 'Key Demands'

Part 3 – Development effectiveness ...

The governments and the donors have to facilitate establishment of a Gender Consultative Council to function in collaboration with donor agencies within the framework of a government-donor agencies coordination mechanism

Part 4 – Promote multiple accountability....

Results-based management principle should become a key approach in planning of donor aid strategies as well as in funding of development programs. In this connection, donor agencies have to be guided not by considerations of their own intrinsic structural and sectoral mandates but by a complex goal of human development implying adherence to gender equality, fairness, poverty alleviation and achievement of an environmental sustainability.

Part 5 – Financing for Development...

Donor agencies have to ensure targeted funding of the budgetary line items of the development programs stipulated for gender component and comprising from 10% to 30% of a total sum of an official aid specified for certain development program.

Part 6 – Development cooperation to the countries of in situation of fragility....

We persistently recommend that donor agencies operating in the field of peace building and security ensure support not only initiatives of a civil society including those initiated by women's groups within the framework of the national governments being characterized by instability and conflicts but promote establishment, strengthening and functioning of global and regional non-governmental structures which will be urged to exert influence upon national states thereby preventing violence within them. The functions of such structures shall include a function of monitoring of adherence of the states, supra-state structures, and international donor agencies themselves to international and national commitments on human rights, including monitoring of gender equity.
